Thompson [aide de camp to Winston Churchill].
Frederick Widdowson Doidge was appointed High Commissioner for New Zealand in the United Kingdom in 1953, the twin summits of his career in London were the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth and the Commonwealth Prime Ministers Conference where he renewed his contacts with Prime Minister Winston Churchill and with Beaverbrook. He died in 1954.
