Art + Objects final auction of the year features a beautiful collection of early New Zealand first editions with some scarce and important books, documents and Maori printings from a major private Auckland library.

It also features scarce publications by Katherine Mansfield including early issues of the Australian periodical 'The Native Companion' with her first published works, as well as the rare first edition of 'In a German Pension' published by Stephen Swift in 1911.

Colonial art includes historic paintings by John Gully, H.G. Robley, John Gibb, W.S. Hatton as well as early rare lithographs of John Williams South Seas published by John Snow and original Baxter prints of the reception and the massacre of the Rev'd John Williams.

Of special interest is a signed copy of Caesar of the Skies by Beau Sheil with fifteen inscriptions and signatures of aviators, aircrew and people associated with the 'Southern Cross'

Other major items are a collection of early New Zealand rugby books from the library of Kevin Lewis well known historian, rugby coach and player it, includes David Gallaher's 'Why the All Blacks Triumphed', London 1906 and other early uncommon editions.

A first edition of 'Out of Africa' by Karen Blixen, London: 1937.

A collection of 1960's Auckland architectural watercolour sketches by Cyril Whiteoak

Early 17th century antiquarian books.

This important sale features some 400 lots.

Art + Object is pleased to announce that its first rare book auction of 2019 will feature the most important collection of Antarctic books ever offered in New Zealand, the superb library of Richard Reaney, noted author, historian and Polar adventurer.

It includes the extremely rare first edition of Shackleton's 'Aurora Australis' published and printed in Antarctica at Cape Royds during the Nimrod Expedition of 1907-1909 while wintering in their hut. One of approximately 80 known copies. A set of Shackleton's 'The Heart of the Antarctic' limited first edition of 3 volumes, bound in vellum. A complete set of 'The Polar Times', 1902-1911 as well as numerous books relating to other international expeditions and the 'Heroic Age of Antarctic Exploration'.

Taylor climbing out of the cockpit over the Tasman Sea succeeded in collecting enough oil from the dead motor to replenish the other and by jettisoning cargo and the mail bags they managed to get the Southern Cross back to Sydney. 'Bill' Taylor was awarded the Empire Gallantry Medal for bravery.

'Harold Gatty' signed on front free endpaper also a scrap of paper in the same writing with inscription 'Sorry cannot very well talk about myself. HG.'

Gatty was an Australian navigator and aviation pioneer.

'With Compliments, Keith Smith' laid onto endpaper.

K. Smith with his brother Ross flew from England to Australia within thirty days, and received the 10,000 pounds prize money from the Australian Government.

'W.M. Hughes', laid onto endpaper.

Hughes was Prime Minister of Australia 1915-1923, leading the country during W.W.1.

'Sincerely Yours Geo. W. Sellars, Wigram 24.4.37'. Inscribed on endpaper.

G. Sellars was a well known New Zealand parachutist, he was killed making a descent at Westport.

Inscription - 'With best Wishes from [?]T [?]Ernte Clark. [Tasman Crossing Nov 1936.' On endpaper.

'Regards John S.W. Stannage, Auckland May 4th 1938'.

J. Stannage was radio operator on board the failed inaugural Trans Tasman Flight, his wireless reports had kept the nation informed of their struggle and reporters and photographers were waiting the exhausted men when the Southern Cross landed.

'In appreciation of your interest in my humble efforts to perpetuate the memory of Smithy and Ulm. Austin E. Byrne, Southern Cross Memorial, Auckland 21st June 1941.

Austin Byrne.

The Southern Cross Memorial was a commemorative object built by Byrne to perpetuate the memory of Charles Kingsford Smith and the Southern Cross.

Conditions of Sale

ART + OBJECT

Please note: it is assumed that all bidders at auction have read and agreed to the conditions described on this page. ART+OBJECT directors are available during the auction viewing to clarify any questions you may have.

1.

Registration: Only registered bidders may bid at auction. You are required to complete a bidding card or absentee bidding form prior to the auction giving your correct name, address and telephone contact + supplementary information such as email addresses that you may wish to supply to ART+OBJECT

2.

Bidding: The highest bidder will be the purchaser subject to the auctioneer accepting the winning bid and any vendor's reserve having been reached. The auctioneer has the right to refuse any bid. If this takes place or in the event of a dispute the auctioneer may call for bids at the previous lowest bid and proceed from this point. Bids advance at sums decreed by the auctioneer unless signaled otherwise by the auctioneer. No bids may be retracted. The auctioneer retains the right to bid on behalf of the vendor up to the reserve figure.

3.

Reserve: Lots are offered and sold subject to the vendor's reserve price being met.

4.

Lots offered and sold as described and viewed: ART+OBJECT makes all attempts to accurately describe and catalogue lots offered for sale. Notwithstanding this neither the vendor nor ART+OBJECT accepts any liability for errors of description or faults and imperfections whether described in writing or verbally. This applies to questions of authenticity and quality of the item. Buyers are deemed to have inspected the item thoroughly and proceed on their own judgment. The act of bidding is agreed by the buyer to be an indication that they are satisfied on all counts regarding condition and authenticity.

5.

Buyers premium: The purchaser by bidding acknowledges their acceptance of a buyers premium of 18.5% plus GST on the premium to be added to the hammer price in the event of a successful sale at auction. Please consult the relevant auction catalogue to confirm the premium for each sale.

6.

ART+OBJECT is an agent for a vendor: A+O has the right to conduct the sale of an item on behalf of a vendor. This may include withdrawing an item from sale for any reason.

7.

Payment: Successful bidders are required to make full payment immediately post sale – being either the day of the sale or the following day. If for any reason payment is delayed then a 20% deposit is required immediately and the balance to 100% required within 3 working days of the sale date. Payment can be made by Eftpos, bank cheque or cash. Cheques must be cleared before items are available for collection. Credit cards are not accepted.

8.

Failure to make payment: If a purchaser fails to make payment as outlined in point 7 above ART+OBJECT may without any advice to the purchaser exercise its right to: a) rescind or stop the sale, b) re offer the lot for sale to an underbidder or at auction. A.

Bidding at auction:

Please ensure your instructions to the auctioneer are clear and easily understood. It is well to understand that during a busy sale with multiple bidders the auctioneer may not be able to see all bids at all times. It is recommended that you raise your bidding number clearly and without hesitation. If your bid is made in error or you have misunderstood the bidding level please advise the auctioneer immediately of your error – prior to the hammer falling. Please note that if you have made a bid and the hammer has fallen and you are the highest bidder you have entered a binding contract to purchase an item at the bid price. New bidders in particular are advised to make themselves known to the sale auctioneer who will assist you with any questions about the conduct of the auction.

B.

The auctioneer will endeavour to cater to the requirements of phone bidders but cannot wait for a phone bid so your prompt participation is requested.

D.
