Art+Object are privileged to be handling a small but important archive of material relating to one of New Zealand's foremost natural historians, Joseph Crosby Smith. It includes his shipboard diary written on his voyage to NZ on board the Calypso in 1876 and a brass microscope built by him when living in Invercargill, with his slides. The collection also includes an original sketch book by John Buchanan containing many fine pencil sketches of native trees, varieties of lichen and fungi etc.

A highlight of this sale is also a major collection of rare books from the library of John Pritchard. John fostered an interest in NZ history and book collecting from an early age and continued throughout his long career in law in Southland and Otago. In the mid 1980's he acquired a significant New Zealand book collection which came from the library of Alfred Eccles, an early colonist, author and historian, and son in law of Johnnie Jones [Otago whaling pioneer].

This collection features a number of important and rare southern histories, New Zealand & Maori histories. Of particular interest is 'The History of Tattooing and its Significance' by W.D. Hambly, London 1925. John's other interest has been military history. The sale includes his complete sets of New Zealand W.W. I. and II, and Official Histories.

Other major items are: A complete set of 'The Voyages of Captain James Cook'. Sydney Parkinson – 'A Journal of a Voyage to the South Seas' London 1784. Edward Jerningham Wakefield – 'Adventure in New Zealand', including the rare folio of plates. 'A History of the Birds of New Zealand' by W.L. Buller [1st & 2nd editions]. A 19th century Eric Craig Fern Album. A long run of British Nautical Almanacs from 1832. Literature includes original typescripts signed and inscribed by Hone Tuwhare. An original manuscript poem by James K. Baxter. 'Pictures from the Tyng Collection: The Royal Photographic Society, June 1931' by Rudolph Koppitz [and others].

# Conditions of sale

John Buchanan emigrated to New Zealand in 1851 aboard the barque 'Columbus' from Gravesend, the journey took 7 months. He came to Dunedin & settled in North East Valley, there he immediately began to collect plants a pursuit which he maintained throughout his life. He published a volume on the indigenous grasses of New Zealand and was founder of the New Zealand Institute contributing many papers and many with his sketches.

### **GUARD BOOK**

They set sail on Saturday the 19th. The diary offers detailed and valuable insight into daily life on board the ship, including weather conditions, gales and

storms, watching for icebergs, numerous observations of marine and bird life. His quite close interactions with crew members, due to his willingness to assist at any time. Encounters with many passing ships. Personal reflections and feelings. Personal anecdotes about selling his private stores, for 3/- giving him some money for the train journey from Port Chalmers to Dunedin, he only had 1 /-, selling his prized telescope for 23/- then rebuying it back for 10/- after it had been raffled, he records "I will watch the money like a cat watches a mouse". Teaching a fellow passenger Shorthand in return for being taught French. Acting as a shipboard doctor treating fellow passengers for boils from eating salted meats. Tells of nearly being washed overboard the sailors calling out to him 'hold fast Joe hold fast, don't let go'. At page 119 he is running out of pages and had to stitch a few more in. 28th Oct passes Cape Lewen [Leeuwin]. Mending his clothes and boots, before he arrives in Port Chalmers. Wednesday 8th Nov. 'All morning, we have had a Nuggets Lighthouse in view about 30 miles south from Dunedin'. Thursday 9th Nov 'at 7 o'clock the long looked for Dunedin was seen behind a small hill, the pilot station coming into sight and we are signalling for him to come aboard which he did with a custom officer. Some saloon passengers going ashore by boat & came back saying 'Port Chalmers is the most beautiful place which anyone would wish to see. He describes the houses saying they look the most happy and contented dwellings, everyone with a small piece of garden of its own. He described the journey to Dunedin, getting lodgings and his luggage. The diary finishes "And thus ends a passage which took us only 73 days from land to land, from Port to Port a passage of 18,000 miles .... I now pray that I may have prosperity'.
